High School Rules

- (1) An essay must be at least 500 words, which is approximately two typed, double-spaced pages. It must be the original work of the student without plagiarizing and without assistance with writing, editing, or rewriting. Assistance may be provided for research purposes only. Essays will be judged on accuracy, quality of writing, spelling, grammar, punctuation, citations, and the engaging presentation of the material.
- (2) Students should provide appropriate source material with either endnotes or footnotes. All quotations used will need a source, as well as any facts cited. The local website, www.CoastalGeorgiasTime.com, provides a downloadable document with material that can be used for research and can be quoted in student papers. More points will be awarded when students follow a proper citation format, such as *The Chicago Manual of Style*.
- (3) All essays should have a title, centered at the top, with the byline of the student under the title. All other pages of the essay should be numbered at the bottom and show the student's name next to the page number.
- (4) On a separate page accompanying the essay or on the bottom of the last page of the essay, the student should provide his or her name, mailing address, phone number, school, grade, and a parent's email address. Students should then either type or hand write the following: "I, (print name), affirm that I am a citizen of the United States, a resident of the Third Senate District of Georgia, and the sole author of this paper. The Glynn County National Day of Prayer Executive Team has my permission to submit my paper for publication in any newspaper or magazine or blog or website with my byline." (Signature).
