High School Rules

(1) An essay (Part 1) must be at least 500 words, but no more than 1000 words, approximately two to four typed, double-spaced pages. The Proclamation (Part 2) must be 250 words, but no more than 500 words, also typed and double-spaced. It must be the original work of the student without plagiarizing and without assistance with writing, editing, or rewriting. Assistance may be provided for research only. Essays will be judged on accuracy, quality, spelling, grammar, punctuation, citations, and the engaging presentation of the material. (2) Students should provide appropriate source material for Part 1, with either endnotes or footnotes. All quotations used will need a source, as well as any facts cited. Students can see sample proclamations and find some helpful source material at www.CoastalGeorgialtsTime.com, in the downloadable document. More points will be awarded when students use additional sources and follow the format of *The Chicago Manual of Style*. (3) All essays should have a title, centered at the top, with the name of the student under the title. All other pages of the essay should be numbered at the bottom and show the student's name next to the page number. (4) On a separate page accompanying the essay and the proclamation, students should provide his or her name, mailing address, phone number, school, grade, and a parent's email address. Students should then type the following: "I, (name), affirm that I am a citizen of the United States, a resident of the Third Senate District of Georgia, and the sole author of this paper. The Glynn County National Day of Prayer Executive Team has my permission to submit my paper and proclamation for publication in any newspaper or magazine or blog or website with my byline."
